Letter from the Pastor



Dear Church Family and Friends,

Merry Christmas! It is something that we have grown accustom to over the years, but are increasingly hearing it less. The new phrase "Happy Holidays" embraces the signs of the times in

which any reference to God is being removed from society. Even Christmas has lost much of its true meaning having given way to "Black Fridays," "Cyber Mondays," sales, family gatherings, the newest electronic gadgets, parades and sporting events. Why has this happened? Perhaps a more important question for us as Christ followers is what will each of us do individually to bring this "Holy Day" back into focus in our lives? I share the following passages with you that we might return once again to God in the midst of this season of celebration.

"For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given; And the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." Isaiah 9:6 (NKJV)

"In the fields outside of Bethlehem that night some shepherds were tending their sheep. Suddenly an angel of the Lord appeared in their midst, and the glory of the Lord shone radiantly. The whole field lit up with his presence. The shepherds were petrified! 'Stop being afraid,' the angel said. 'I have come to bring you good news which will bring great joy to all people of the world. The Messiah has come! Your Savior was born today in Bethlehem, the town of David! You will know you have found him when you discover a baby wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger.' Suddenly, an army of heavenly hosts appeared with the angel, filling the sky. They raised their voices in song:

'Glory to God in the highest Heaven! And on earth, peace to those with whom God is pleased!' Then, as quickly as they appeared, the angels were gone into heaven. 'This is too good to miss,' the shepherds said to one another. 'Let's go straight to Bethlehem now. Let's see for ourselves what the Lord has announced to us.' They raced into town as fast as they could and found their way to Mary and Joseph and, as they had been told, the baby lying in a manger. Trembling with excitement at seeing the baby, the shepherds poured out the story the angel had told them about this child. All the people listened, astonished. As for Mary, she treasured it all in her heart and kept thinking about it, but said nothing. The shepherds eventually returned to their flock, glorifying and praising God for all that they had heard and seen, just as they had been told." This Christmas, it is my humble prayer that we will each take the time to reflect on that night when the greatest gift, then and forever, was given to humanity in the form of a baby. Also, please be aware that Red Bird Mission is **no longer** accepting Campbell Soup labels.




(A WORD FROM THE DIRECTOR, STEVEN J. SCHMIDT)



Financial Update

Numbers above represent our operating expenses, our connectional expenses (monies to support the greater United Methodist Church) and our building mortgage. In 2015 and 2016, we paid 100% of our connectional giving, but due to the decreased giving in 2017, the Administrative Team voted in June to suspend our connectional giving unless someone actually designated their giving for connectional. The Admin Team will decide prior to the end of the year if any additional payments will be made toward our connectional giving for 2017. While we do have some cash on hand and had monthly connectional payments been made, we would be out of cash and still be behind in our connectional giving. The important thing to understand is that if year over year giving continues to decrease, it will not be too long until we will need to cut spending in other critical areas (staff, building repairs, heat and air, etc.). While the November giving increased slightly over October, our expenses also increased at a faster rate resulting in a deficit for the month. To date, we have made our mortgage payment in full and timely.

The above loss of \$5,300 for the first eleven months of 2017 does not include the major building repairs/maintenance made to date totaling \$28,500. These repairs have been paid out of some reserve funds that were not designated for any ministry or program. Currently, we are aware of only another \$1,000 in major building repairs facing us.

Per the information above, on an average weekly basis, our expenses are approximately \$6,400 while our income is only \$6,300.
