In this Lenten series which begins Sunday, February 18, we will follow Jesus' path in prayerful hope that we might be inspired to set our eyes on our road to resurrection and to a better understanding and celebration on Easter Sunday.



Letter from the Pastor



Dear Church Family and Friends,

Valentine's Day is fast approaching . . . the day set aside to express our love and devotion to those for whom we truly care about. For others, it is simply another day or an opportunity to

put love into action. And for some it is a day of expectation to receive love and affection. A "Valentine" is generally defined as *"a card sent,* often anonymously, on St. Valentine's Day (February 14) to a person one loves or is attracted to; a person to whom one sends a card on Valentine's Day." (source: online dictionary - Google)

In anticipation of this upcoming day, I thought it appropriate to share what it means to love God in Christ . . . with all . . . heart, soul, mind and strength. Let me begin with this familiar scripture story of Jesus' reunion with the disciples on the shores of the Sea of Tiberias.

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these" He said to him a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me" He said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" - John 21:15 (ESV)

This was a piercing question for Peter that morning when Jesus met them on the shore. Peter had denied knowing Jesus the night He was betrayed and that had to be weighing heavy on his heart and mind. Peter truly loved Jesus but needed to be reminded of his love so he could move forward and live it out in deed and in truth.

This is also a piercing question for us. Do we truly love the Lord our God in Christ Jesus? Do we need to be continually reminded of that love. The answer lies in how often we choose to deny Jesus or follow Him. In our humanity with its sinful nature, we will always need to be reminded of God's love for us. I believe the closer and more intimate you become in your relationship with Christ, the less you need reminding of His love for you.

So what does it mean to love God? Following are two essential ways we can express our love to God in Jesus.

Obedience. Jesus said, "If you love Me, keep my commandments." - John 14:15

Love others . . . in deed and in truth. Love is something you do sacrificially for others that brings the feeling and emotions we often mistake as love. - John 3:18; John 4:7

Perhaps Jesus is asking us to make Him our valentine. After all, He has already made us His! May God richly bless.

NAMI Basics is a free, 6-week education program for parents and family caregivers of children and teens who are experiencing symptoms of a mental illness or who have already been diagnosed. NAMI Basics is offered in a group setting so you can connect with other people dealing with similar issues.
