I'm a Pastor and I Want You to Quit Church. Now!

(The following is adapted from the book, **Quit Church** by Chris Sonksen who pastors South Hills Church and is founder of ChurchBOOM. This adaptation was shared by Jane Tipton as a devotional at the July Admin Team meeting with her encouragement that Christ Church cannot lose sight of its mission which is to lead others to Christ.)

At a time when church attendance is shrinking in America, I, a pastor, am encouraging people to quit church. Why? The answer is birthed out of conversations and research I've been a part of over the last several years.

Regularly, I meet and train pastors and church leaders from all over the country through my leadership platform, ChurchBOOM. The conversations carry a common theme - a lot of people who attend church are passive towards serving, giving and community outreach. In most churches, 80% of the work is being carried out by 20% or less of the people. We've become a church of spectators and the pastoral staff is getting burned out. According to my own personal research, the problems are even bigger than the 80/20 principle.

Only 39% of active believers consider the Bible as the literal Word of God. Less than 20% of professing believers follow the biblical principle of giving. Only 5% have shared their faith with a non-believer. More than half of all church members attend church once a month or less.

Something has to change.

Casual attendance and the belief that others will serve, give and share the Gospel are tearing down churches across our country brick by brick. As believers, it is time that we are either all in or we get out. The solution is simple: quit! That's right - quit! If we quit the casual way we approach God's principles, can you imagine what would happen in our personal walks of faith and in our community of believers?

What if every believer exercised generosity? What if every Christian fought for loyalty in the local church? What if everyone served in their God-given purpose? What would happen if we stopped simply believing and started belonging?

The way that God works is one thing that fascinates me, moves me, and causes me to marvel at the wonder-working power of God as well as the intricate design of the providential tapestry of human destiny. I never cease to be amazed at how God can turn crises into heaven's opportunities or how God can bring victory out of defeat, redemption out of situations that seem to be unsalvageable, or good out of evil. In other words, we as Christians should always celebrate the fact that God is able to make a miracle out of a mess. God is a specialist in the recycling business. It is because of his specialty in recycling that all persons are able to gain eternal life through the blood of Jesus Christ.

Again, thank you for allowing me this gracious opportunity to be a part of your ministry team at Christ Church. THANK YOU!

If we would only quit the way we approach our relationship to Christ and our local church, the blessing, the reward, the joy, the fulfillment, the purpose, and the increase would radically transform our lives and the world. Together, we can revolutionize the church!

But the only way we can do this is if we quit!

My conversations over the past several years revealed the spiritual habits necessary for personal and church growth and revealed the "why" behind disengagement in the church.

The truth is, if we don't feel passionate about something we don't do it. If we don't like something that happens in the church, we find another one. If the spiritual practices don't fit our lifestyle, then we don't do them.

This mindset permeates our "I want it now and I want it my way" culture and is only enforced through social media, website choices, TV options and countless other platforms that have risen in prominence in our lives. This is not the way God intended the church to live.

The local church isn't a building - it's a body of believers fulfilling God's purpose in our lives. When these believers approach their individual involvement and commitment in a casual manner it weakens the entire body of Christ and the impact we are called to have. As a result, we lose and so does the local church. God wants us to win, to thrive, to fulfill our potential in Him. We will not experience the abundance He desires for us until we quit our current approach and we are all-in.

Once you go all-in on generosity, serving, outreach, discipleship and the other biblical behaviors laid out in His word then look out because God will rain on your life with His blessings like you have never experienced.

Jesus felt the church was worth dying for - it should be our mission as Christians to value living for it.

Financial Update

Note: The numbers above have been adjusted to omit connectional income and expenses. Due to our income not meeting expenses, the Administrative Team voted in June to stop all connectional payments in an effort to meet our operating expenses. Our mortgage payment was made in full in July. The significant income reported for July is due to not incurring any pastoral salary expense or related benefit expenses.

As a benchmark, our budgeted expenses, excluding connectional, for 2018 average just over \$26,000 per month. While our actual July year-to-date expenses averaged just a little over \$24,300 a month, our actual giving is only averaging approximately \$23,800 a month.

A second benchmark we use is to compare our average weekly envelope giving this year to last year. That comparison indicates that we are averaging approximately \$450 less per week of giving (\$450 x 52 weeks would increase our annual giving by over \$23,000!).

A pastor began a Bible study consisting of eight men in a small prison in Esquintla, Guatemala using **Love Packages** material. One of the men who received Christ and helped lead the study was recently released from prison and returned to his home. While working in the fields trying to stay clean and away from the gangs, a member of the 18th Street gang approached him and asked if he had become an evangelical Christian. The man responded by say, "Yes, by the grace of God I have." The gang member dropped to his knees and asked if he could receive Jesus. The man prayed with him and helped him receive Christ. The gang member left and an hour later was killed by a rival gang.

In 2015, **Love Packages** shipped 1,205 tons of literature and in the last ten years has shipped 10,058 tons which represents over 400 million pieces of Christian literature.

We collect Christian material for Love Packages, both new and slightly used. Please leave any materials you wish to donate in the library marked "Love Packages." We have shipped 42.4 pounds to Love Packages thus far in 2018. Thank you for your continued support.



Pill Bottles Aid California Wildfire Victims

In early August, Matthew 25 Ministries' disaster response team left for California along with a fleet of disaster vehicles including two "Tide Loads of Hope" mobile laundry units. The fleet also included shipments of personal care and clean-up kits, paper products, baby items and Tide pods which is all made possible through your donations of pill bottles which are recycled for monies to support Matthew 25 Ministries' relief efforts for the victims of the California wildfires. Matthew 25 Ministries is an international humanitarian aid and disaster relief organization based in Blue Ash and is supported by many local businesses including Procter & Gamble.

As of July 2018, we have collected 6,547 pill bottles. Empty pill bottles can be left in the marked container in the library. Note: Labels do not need to be removed.
