Letter from the Pastor



Dear Christ Church Family and Friends,

As we come to the end of 2018 with anticipation of entering 2019, I want to take this time to wish you and your families a blessed and happy season. Some may say they have nothing to be merry or happy about because of their

current situation. This may be true because 2018 has been a year of both challenges for some and successes for others. If you are one of those who faced a serious challenge in 2018, I encourage you not to give up. For some of us, death snatched away someone who was dear to us, others may have experienced a serious illness in their family, some had financial difficulties and other challenges that they had to deal with. However, through it all, God granted us His grace to go through whatever we experienced and come out victorious. That to me is success. Even if you have not yet rebounded from your challenges, don't despair, but take heart, it will happen sooner than later. The Word of God states, "Weeping may endure for the night but **JOY** cometh in the morning." Your morning is on the horizon, watch fervently for it.

- If we cling to death, we will die. That is a fact. In order to be faithful, we have to accept the risk of failure. There is no room for petty fights over church turf in the Kingdom of God.

In closing, may the Words of the Lord as written in Psalm 37:4-5 and Isaiah 58:13-14 be your portion in 2019. Be safe during this Christmas season and keep your eyes on Jesus. He will take you places in 2019 that you've never dreamed of.

FAITH--Let's Build on It!

For we walk by faith, not by sight II Corinthians 5:7 (NKJV)

As you may already know, **Christ Church received a very generous gift from the family of Carol and Paul Hoskins** after Carol's passing in July 2018. The gift, in the amount of \$99,700, was designated to help us reduce the mortgage obligation on our church building. At the time of the gift, the family encouraged us to begin a capital campaign to raise additional funds to help us continue to reduce the remaining debt balance. Beginning today, we are launching our **"FAITH--Let's Build on It!"** Campaign to accomplish what the Hoskins' Family started.

Background: Our current mortgage is approximately \$227,000 payable over the next 13 years with a monthly payment of almost \$2,000. With the Hoskins gift, our mortgage balance will be reduced to about \$127,000 - and so with faith the goal of this Campaign is to reduce the remaining balance by as much as possible to free up dollars to use toward ministries that God is planning and will <u>Reveal to us</u>. It is our hope that once the Campaign is complete, we will be able to significantly reduce our monthly payment either through re-amortization or re-financing of the balance - perhaps we will be blessed enough to completely eliminate the debt!

There are three ways to express your FAITH to give to this Campaign:

One-time Special Gift during December and January: He gave His son, once, so we are beginning with a one-time gift request so that we may combine lump-sum gifts with the Hoskins Family gift and apply toward the loan <u>all at once in February</u> <u>2019</u>. While special gifts are welcome at any time during this 18-month Campaign, we are starting with an initial effort so **please make your one-time gift by January 31, 2019**.

Pledge Gift - 18 month commitment through July 1, 2020: He led His disciples over many months and years, and so we would ask you to prayerfully consider making a <u>pledge payable through July 1, 2020</u>, to increase your current giving by an amount of your choice, earmarked for the Campaign. **Please make your pledge by January 31, 2019.**

Both a One-time Special Gift and a Pledge Gift: He continues to call us to serve all He represents, each and every day. If you feel called to make both a special gift and a pledge, please make both commitments by January 31, 2019. This provides initial mortgage reduction and longer-term reduction.

Next Steps: For every \$1 given to the Campaign through one-time giving and/or pledging, Christ Church will save \$1.32 - so no one-time gift or pledge is too small! As you consider your gift, please earnestly pray for God's guidance and His blessing over our church and our ministries both now and as a result of the Campaign.

Pledge cards will be included in a letter being sent to the congregation the week of December 2, and pledge cards and envelopes will be available in the pews throughout the Campaign so that your Campaign gifts can be separated from your regular giving. Pledges can be designated as one-time, monthly, quarterly, or yearly for the 18 months, February 1, 2019 through July 1, 2020.

Throughout the Campaign we will give updates on the Campaign's progress. If you have any questions, please ask one of our committee members whose names and emails are provided below. As we begin today with this Campaign, we are reminded that with God, ALL things are possible for the Community of Christ who we serve!

Financial Update (as of 10/31/2018)

Note: Our mortgage payment was made in full for October. Compared to September, both our income and our expenses increased which resulted in income decreasing about \$3,000 from September. Our expenses in October also include a full month of salary and benefits for our new pastor versus only a partial month of expenses in September.

As a benchmark, our budgeted expenses for 2018 average just over \$25,700 per month. The good news is that our actual October yearto-date expenses are averaging just a little under \$22,700 a month and our actual giving is averaging around \$23,600 a month!

A second benchmark we use is to compare our average weekly envelope giving this year to last year. That comparison indicates that we are averaging approximately \$400 less per week of giving (\$400 x 52 weeks would increase our annual giving by over \$23,000!).

THE STORY OF LOVE PACKAGES

140 Tons of Good News

Then and now, the gospel message requires messengers. One noteworthy gospel messenger is *Love Packages*, a ministry whose small staff and countless volunteers collect, sort, package, and ship <u>about 140 tons of donated Christian literature</u> <u>each month</u> free to mission fields around the world.

In today's high-tech world, many might assume that all magazines and used Sunday school books are relics of the past. If you live in a dung hut in Nairobi, Kenya, however, there is no online website, no book sale, or hardly any stores. Even if print was available, the people can't afford it. So, this is a way to get materials to them.

Founded in 1975 in Butler, Illinois by Steve Schmidt, *Love Packages* began after repeated nudges from God to offer to missionaries the excess Christian literature always piling up on the Schmidt's' dining table.

Surprised to discover that missionaries could use and want the English language materials he offered, Schmidt quickly mailed packages to four different locations. By year's end, he and his wife had shipped out 60 packages filled with used Bibles, books, magazines, Sunday school materials, tracts, and devotionals. Word spread, and soon others began sending literature to the Schmidt family. Volunteers began helping sort and package the donated materials. And slowly their ministry grew from the Schmidt's' dining room to their basement to a warehouse facility.

In 2016, *Love Packages* expanded to include Edwin L. Hodges Ministries, a similar literature ministry run by Pastor Hodges for 20 years in Decatur, Alabama. When Hodges retired, *Love Packages* was the perfect ministry to keep the Hodges legacy going forward. Subsequently, *Love Packages* now operates out of both sites. Individuals, families, or youth groups can volunteer at either location, and they're doing something that's eternal. They're going on a mission trip without having to leave the country.

One lady in particular, now in her 90s, still goes out "booking" weekly to purchase appropriate materials at yard sales, book sales, or discount stores. She recruits friends to transport her book finds to *Love Packages* in Illinois. A man in Huntsville, Alabama does his "booking" differently. He periodically shops online at Christianbook.com and has his purchases shipped directly to the Alabama site.

The donated literature is first brought from the warehouse and then opened, sorted and placed into one of six designated categories: Bibles, reference materials; Sunday school literature; books; magazines and daily devotionals; music and DVDS. Churches, individuals, and even corporate donors send excess literature, new or used, one piece or cases at a time. The largest category of donations is Sunday school literature. Finally, the bundled literature is taken into an outer warehouse ready for loading onto a 20-foot shipping container – no pallets or packing materials allowed. *Love Packages* literally packs materials into the shipping container from floor to ceiling. *Every hole could be a soul.*

Love Packages ships 41,800 pounds of literature in each seagoing container at an overall freight cost of ten cents per pound. That is impressive stewardship compared to the \$8 per pound it would cost for an individual to mail a package overseas. Once materials are shipped, it takes approximately two months before the containers are opened and distributed.

And the last step for the donated materials is probably the most impressive of all. Men and women from impoverished countries around the world will walk for days over untold miles in order to receive the treasures packed into those shipping containers. Many of them have never seen printed copies of Scripture verses, much less owned their own Bible. When they get their *Love Packages*, they're smiling ear to ear.

Please continue to leave your donated (new or used) materials in the container marked "Love Packages" in the library. We are "recycling the word of God."

The Meaning of Advent

Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel. (Isaiah7:14)

"Advent" simply means *coming* as in Christ is coming, and for us now He has arrived. This is referring to His birth in history and in humanity. It meant the welcoming or the arrival of a special king and for us; it is our King of kings. This is what the Old Testament prophecies foretold concerning Jesus' Incarnation, the Word made flesh for our hope and Atonement that brought us our deliverance. Advent represents our expectation, anticipation, and preparation for who Christ is and what He has done for us. He arrived into the world as a human being, being fully God and fully man. He came to identify as one of us, as the *Son of Man*, as a baby born in a manger. He came for us, He came for you and He comes into our lives and into our hearts. He is coming again in great power and glory to bring His Kingdom into fruition.

The Advent Wreath

And again, Isaiah says, "The Root of Jesse will spring up, one who will arise to rule over the nations; the Gentiles will hope in him." May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit (Rom. 15:12-13).

Traditionally, during the Christmas season we have an "Advent Wreath" in our churches, and this is remarkably celebrated in all denominations, including Orthodox, Catholic, liturgical, mainline and evangelical. The Advent Wreath is a venerable tradition that cuts across denominational and theological boundaries. It dates to the beginning of the 19th century in Europe. This Advent Wreath is arranged with 4 or 5 Advent candles, 3 or 4 of which are in a circle, along with one in the center, all on a base of evergreens each has a powerful message for us about our Lord. This has prevailing imagery we should not take for granted or consider just another holiday decoration.

The Wreath: The wreath itself means "victory" as Christ's victory over sin so He can save us. The Advent Wreath has 4 or 5 candles that are arranged in a circle symbolizing Christ's eternity, as a circle has no beginning and has no end, it is a symbol for God who is eternal and thus without beginning or end. The evergreens mean He is "ever with us," and are usually pine branches or holly that are used as a base that represents anticipation, newness, renewal and His everlastingness. The red berries of the holly represent the shedding of Christ's blood.

The Candles: The Advent candles mean the light of God coming into the world through the birth of His Son. This refers to the significance that Christ is the Light of the world. When they are lit, the illumination is to symbolize the Christ of eternity and His coming as the "Light of the World" and our worship and honor of His most precious gift of His Grace and mercy. These candles also have a color theme too, purple, pink or rose and white. The first two or three are purple meaning royalty and this is also the color of suffering and the darkness of sin, connecting Jesus' birth and crucifixion and His triumph over sin. Pink means joy, and white means purity.

Each candle has a special meaning:

- o The first candle (purple) "CANDLE OF HOPE" means His promise and hope. We can have hope because God is faithful and will keep the promises He made to us. Our hope comes from God. (Romans 15:12-13)
- o The second candle (purple) "CANDLE OF PREPARATION" means His light and preparation. Preparation means to 'get ready'. "Help us to be ready to welcome YOU, O GOD!" (Luke 3:4-6) (Some traditions combine the first two.)
- o The third candle (pink or rose) "CANDLE OF JOY" means the angels sang a message of JOY! (Luke 2:7-15)
- o The fourth candle (purple) "CANDLE OF LOVE" symbolizes Christ love. God sent His only Son to earth to save us, because He loves us! (John 3:16-17) (Some traditions omit this one.)
- o The fifth candle (white) "CHRIST CANDLE" symbolizes the incarnation, the heart and reason of the season, God giving light to the world. Its location is in the center as Christ's light is central and radiant. This reminds us that Jesus is the spotless Lamb of God, sent to wash away our sins! (In wreaths that have 4 candles, it is in the circle among the rest of the candles.)

Each candle is lighted during the worship services each week in progression until Christmas Eve or Christmas Day when the last candle is lit. (Some denominations and traditions have different color schemes and some only four candles.) Each week the new unlit candle for that week is lighted, and then the previous candles are re-lighted. A family is sent up to do the lighting as a passage is read, a carol sung and or a prayer said. The four weeks are a period of waiting also signifying the four centuries of waiting between the last prophet Malachi and the birth of Jesus. All five candles should continue to be lighted in worship services through Epiphany on January 6 (*Epiphany* means "to show," is the climax of the Christmas Season and the "Twelve Days of Christmas." It is observed to denote the coming of the wise men bringing gifts and their worship to Christ).
