Letter from the Pastor



My beloved Parishioners,

One of the tragedies of our modern life is our loss of the sense of the sacred. We have lost the sense of sacred time and sacred places. We have lost that sense of "holy otherness" towards the Divine and those places and times when and where the Divine is encountered in unique and transforming ways. Our modern world,

when approaching God at all, wants to reduce God to our best buddy or hold God off at some untouchable distance. Gone is the sense of awe that the Bible sometimes calls the "fear of God." We have lost that sense that in encountering God we are meeting both power and mystery.

The senseless attacks of bombings, burnings and killings in places of worship today is alarming. When innocent worshippers are now becoming targets of hatred and bigotry, we have truly lost our sense of sacredness.

This sense of the sacred is captured in Exodus 3:2-6 when Moses encounters God's presence in the burning bush on Mt. Horeb. When Moses draws close to the burning bush, the voice of God tells Moses to remove his sandals. When Moses realizes who it is he is meeting, we are told: *"And Moses hid his face; for he was afraid to look upon God."* Exodus describes God as both intimate (God speaks directly to Moses several times) and as the "holy other." It is difficult for us to wrap our minds around a God who is both, yet that is the mysterious nature of God. To deny one or the other aspect of God is to miss who God is.

In Jesus Christ we encounter the "Word became flesh . . ." (John 1:14) That which we cannot see and touch became in the person of Christ ". . . what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands . . ." (1 John 1:1)

A week after our Lord's resurrection the disciples were gathered in a locked and shuttered room when the risen Lord appeared to them. When Thomas realizes the reality of the resurrection when he sees the nail prints in Jesus' palms exclaims, "*My Lord and my God!*" His proclamation of belief is also an expression of encounter with the sacred. Suddenly the ordinary locked room became a sacred place with the presence of the risen Lord.

Early Christians seeking to recognize the uniqueness of Christ's resurrection made the first day of the week (our Sunday) into a weekly celebration of the Lord's rising from the tomb which they called the Lord's Day (Revelation 1:10). The first Christians observed the seventh day of the week as their Sabbath, the same as the Jewish community, (see Acts 17:1-2 and 18:4) but over time as Christians increasingly became aware that their movement was something different than Judaism from which it had originally sprung, they adopted the first day of the week, or the Lord's Day as they called it, our Sunday as their weekly Sabbath. As Christianity moved into a New Testament faith and away from Old Testament religion, it still maintained a sense of the sacredness of time.

Christians need to recapture a sense of the sacred. The day popularly called "Easter" ought to invoke feelings of both God's closeness to us as well as fear and awe. To witness one who was crucified yet who now lives is not only miraculous but also terrifying.

The Gospel of Mark captures a sense of the awe, power, and mystery of the empty tomb experience when, in its original ending, we find the women who have come to the tomb to anoint Jesus' body encountering the "man in white" who tells them that "... He has been raised." (Mark 16:6) and their response is: "And they went out quickly and fled from the sepulcher, for they trembled and were amazed. Neither said anything to any man, for they were afraid." (Mark 16:8)

Unfortunately, modern Christians have largely forgotten the sense of the sacred. We have transformed a living and dynamic faith with a sense of reverence and awe into something of a mechanical religion. We go to church. We attend committee meetings. We work for the institution, and we somehow miss connecting with God as a living, powerful, and often terrifying presence. We have lost the sense of mystery and wonder.

No wonder the world outside the church watches us going through the motions and wonders what it is all about. However, there is still time to recover the sacred in time for this season. It will require many of us to lay aside our desire to gratify our biggest idols — our egos — and to set aside the time we worship as sacred time. Most of the trappings of Easter can be laid aside as we approach God with humility. That will also mean listening to the story of Christ's resurrection with fresh ears, and to imagine ourselves in that sacred place where the first disciples found themselves awed, baffled, and transformed.

Finally, as we celebrate Mother Day's this month, take the time to thank your mother and let her know how much you love her. Mothers are God's special gifts to all of us. Cherish her, love her, respect her and honor her simply because she brought you and me into the world. Don't let her down; she brought you up. Happy Mother's Day.
