## New Security Protocols In Effect

Christ Church is pleased to partner with Northstar Classical School as classes began on August 27. Christ Church and Northstar have worked together to establish updated security protocols for the building, focusing particularly during Christ Church's office hours from 9:00 am - 2:00 pm Mondays through Thursdays, and Northstar's school hours from 8:15 am - 3:30 pm Tuesdays through Fridays with the faculty/staff using the facility on Mondays.

### **Entry to the Building**

- During the week, the main entrance for Christ Church will be the Marshall Street doors; Northstar will use the
  entrance from the west parking lot as their main entrance. To assist with security, these entrances are solely
  for the purpose of Christ Church and Northstar, and so congregants and Northstar faculty/students/parents
  must enter through the appropriate door as well as visitors.
- All outside doors will be kept locked to ensure the safety of Church staff and Northstar faculty and children.
- A coded lock box has been installed at the Marshall Street entrance containing a key that will unlock the outside door. The code will be shared with those who need access to the building on a more regular basis but do not have need for an outside door key.
- A wireless buzzer will also be installed at the Marshall Street entrance for those wishing entry into the church building, e.g., mailperson, repairman, etc. during office hours so that the church secretary is alerted that someone is at the door.

### **Identification of Christ Church and Northstar Staff and Faculty**

- Church and school personnel will be wearing appropriate lanyard identification during office and school hours.
- Visitor lanyards specific to Christ Church and Northstar will be provided to assist with safety.

### **Overall Building Access to Christ Church**

• If you have a group, e.g., Bible Study, UMW, committee, etc., meeting during school hours, you will need to position a person at the door you will be using for your group's entry into the building. Please insure that at **no time** is a door unlocked and unattended for a meeting or gathering during school hours. This is also a good security practice for groups meeting during non-school hours.

#### **Northstar Space**

• The classroom area as contracted between Christ Church and Northstar and often referred to by the church as the "Children's Wing" will not be accessible to congregants during the school day. Northstar will install stanchions at the entry points to their area as a visual reminder that "school is in session."

Thank you for understanding the need for such protocols given the times in which we live and the importance of protecting not only the children of Northstar but also the personnel of both Christ Church and Northstar. We are also mindful that the protocols shared above may need to be adjusted and/or that new protocols formulated as we experience our shared visioning within the church walls, so please be patient with both Northstar and Christ Church as we navigate this new partnership with one another.

Johnathon has autism. His parents are veterans of Desert Storm. He stopped talking at 3-1/2. After one session on a horse, he began talking excitedly to his Dad. His mom wrote this about the help received from Jacob's Fund: "Oh my, the Lord is so good to us!!!"



### Carissa

Carissa, a sweet 10-year-old, has an emotional disorder, ADHD and autism. These developmental impairments have created difficulties in may areas of life, from hygiene to social skills. Hippotherapy helps her overcome sensory aversions and increases her ability to complete tasks.
