## Letter from the Pastor



My beloved Parishioners,

To all who read these pages, I greet you in the name of our Liberating Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

This year has been one of the most challenging years in my 33 years of

ministry in the West Ohio Conference. Throughout my journey of ministry when I find myself in these situations, I lean on the Rock who is Jesus Christ. The hymn writer was right when he wrote these words, "My hope is built on nothing less than Jesus' blood and righteousness. I dare not trust the sweetest frame, but wholly lean on Jesus' name."

Keeping a church together is not a simple thing, but it becomes twice as hard in a pandemic. We may have different points of view, different skills, and different understandings. Yet the Holy Spirit seeks to knit us together for Christ's good purpose according to the New Testament. The Apostle Paul calls the church a body (see Romans 12:1-8, I Corinthians 12:7-12). Like a body, a church's health can be affected if there is something amiss in even one small part of it. All the parts of the body are joined together for the common good. Sometimes we forget that and insist on our own way before all others. Sometimes we fail to look to our own spiritual health and then wonder why the church around us seems to be struggling. The church does not come together out of magic but by the will of the Holy Spirit. Our own attitudes, selfishness, strife and sin can weaken the body. Let us hold one another in prayer, showing mutual respect, and each act in a loving and responsible way for the good of Christ's Church.

We cannot be together much this Advent. We have prepared an Advent Study for use in your homes. I want to encourage you to stop by and get a copy from the church office or call and we will have one mailed to you. Please read it together as a family and have a discussion. I will be preaching on the same theme each week. I would like to encourage our Sunday School classes to use this material for the Advent Season also. First week: The Journey of Promise Second week: The Journey of Faith Third week: The Journey of Hope Fourth week: The Journey of Love

Finally, I want to express my sincere thanks and appreciation to all of you that have faithfully continued to support this ministry financially. Even though some of you are unable to attend the in-person worship service, you have faithfully dropped-off or mailed in your tithe and offering. May God richly bless you for your faithfulness to His church. With God all things are possible. Although we did not have the rummage sale or the Fall Festival, God did the impossible and we give Him all the praise.
