Digitally Moving Forward to Replace a Dilapidated Sign

After six months of discussing and researching signage options to replace the dilapidated sign on the corner of Grand and Marshall Avenues, the Administrative Board entered into a contractual arrangement with Wilson Electronic Displays to purchase a 16mm pitch pixel electronic sign at a cost of \$10,240. The sign will provide optimal readability for passers-by and will provide a tremendous opportunity for us to share our plans and upcoming activities with the community as we strive to become a more inviting place.

Bids were solicited from two companies, and Wilson Electronic Displays provided the lower of the two bids. After carefully reviewing the many "Various Accounts" and specifically the "Memorial Account" which had a balance of \$8,175 to determine how we might pay for the sign without impacting our operating funds, the Administrative Board paid the 50% deposit required by Wilson Electronic Displays, or \$5,405, from the "Memorial Account" which has not been used for several years but has experienced steady growth. We are very excited to announce that in addition to another \$600 we received in donations toward the cost of the sign, **AN ANONYMOUS DONOR HAS ALSO COME FORWARD TO PAY THE REMAINING BALANCE.** Tom Streiff has completed the electrical work necessary for the new sign which has resulted in a savings of over \$1,100 in anticipated start-up costs. The modest \$35 monthly electrical cost of the sign will be split between Christ Church (two-thirds) and Northstar Classical School (one-third). Additionally, there are plans to do some repair work to the wood on the top of the existing sign. The decision to purchase this new electronic sign was within the authority of the Administrative Board to do so, and the delivery and installation of the sign is anticipated early this Fall.

Finance Update

Our envelope giving continues to decline . . . during the month of June, the average weekly giving was \$3,154; in the month of July, the average weekly giving fell to \$2,794.

Our total income for the year 2021 (ending in July) was \$147,217. The total expenses for that same period was \$139,410. We have managed to keep our building maintenance expenses to \$1,853 and have reduced our building and solar panel insurance to \$9,675 for the fiscal year. The monthly rent for Northstar has increased to approximately \$1,500.

We pray that our church family will prayerfully contribute to our operating income so that Christ Church may continue. Thank you.

Christ Church started collecting Christian materials for *Love Packages* in 2014. From 2014 until the end of August 2021, Christ Church has collected 1,441 pounds of Christian materials. This is an average of approximately 180 pounds per year.

A recent testimony from a Pastor in Zambia . . . *"I would like to thank God for the wonderful materi als I have received. I received a bag of books and among the books were 20 Bibles which I have given to members of our church, and also the wonderful 'Explore the Bible' materials. Now my church's knowledge has grown so much due to the books like 'The Purpose Driven Life' by Rick Warren and the study Bibles."*



Christ Church started collecting pill bottles for Matthew 25 Ministries in 2012. From 2012 until the end of August 2021, Christ Church has collected 20,113 pill bottles. This is an average of approximately 2,011 pill bottles per year.

Our pill bottle collection is recycled for cash that then goes toward Matthew 25 Ministries' programs. More than 99% of Matthew 25 Ministries' cash and in-kind donations go toward its programs to feed the hungry, provide clean water to the thirsty, provide clothing to the naked, provide affordable shelter to the homeless, provide medical care to the ill, and provide humanitarian supplies to those in need. At present, Matthew 25 is responding to the devastating earthquake in Haiti.

Please leave your empty plastic pill bottles (both prescription and over-the-counter pill bottles accepted; we cannot accept glass bottles, however) and your Christian materials (both adult and children) in our Library. The pill bottle container is located on top of the file cabinet and the Love Package container is located on the floor underneath the mail slots.
