

Letter from the Pastor



Greetings Beloved!

So much is happening in our world. Again, war is preferred over peace; selfish hoarding over compassionate sharing; and more that is not in line with the ways and

teachings of Jesus Christ. Lord, have mercy. We need a pause. Yes, pause. This Sunday we will pause and marvel at the wonder of the Transfiguration of our Jesus. Sometimes we need to be blown away; left speechless and breathless, just to know that God is God. God Creator speaks audibly for the disciples to hear, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him." (Luke 9:35) Imagine this experience for them. There is a recurring reminder from God to "listen." Last week Jesus said, ". . . to those who listen." (Luke 6:27) And now Creator God commands the disciples to listen. This Living Word applies to us in February 2022! Beloved, pause and embrace the awe this upcoming Sunday.

The Lenten season is always timely, but particularly for us today. Again, we need a pause. It is necessary to pause, reflect, and fast from food *and* behaviors. Jesus set this model of *pause* through prayer, meditation, and fasting. We will begin our journey to the cross with Jesus with the Ash Wednesday service. We begin our Lenten journey by worshiping together on Ash Wednesday, which is the reminder that we are mortal beings. We journey for 40 days because prior to Jesus beginning His ministry, He spent 40 days in the wilderness fasting and praying. Jesus paused. Lent is the time for his followers to do the same.

I will lead a Bible Study during Lent: *Following Jesus: Steps to a Passionate Faith*, by Carolyn Slaughter. The study will focus on the nature of Christ, what it means to be a follower of Jesus Christ, and what we do with the unique gifts God has given each one of us. Jesus spent time in the wilderness to prepare for His ministry. We must spend time in preparation for the ministry God has for each of us individually, and as the Body of Christ. Join me for this insightful study. Let us journey in the wilderness together with Christ as our guide. Join in person or via zoom. Do not miss this opportunity to be in fellowship, prayer, and reflection with God and the Body of Christ in this most important season of the Christian faith.

Financial Update

It saddens me to report to the congregation that we end the month of January with a \$2,934 net loss. Our Duke Energy bill for the month of January was \$3,302 after reimbursement from Northstar and Meals on Wheels. Even though we have increased Northstar's monthly rent, Meals on Wheels' monthly rent, and had no Music Director we still were looking at a net loss of close to \$3,000.

The envelope giving was \$12,054. Loose change offering was \$605 and Initial offering was \$117. Our total net income for the month of January was \$18,828. Our total expenses were \$21,762.

In February the giving doesn't look to have increased so we will close out February with another next loss. Please prayerfully consider your giving. Your church relies on you.

Ministry Wins Super Bowl Challenge



There was much hype and celebration in Cincinnati leading up to this year's Super Bowl and while the final score was not the outcome Cincinnati fans hoped for, there was and is still much to celebrate for not only an incredible Bengals season (Who Dey!) but also in God's kingdom.

In the spirit of Super Bowl Sunday, Bishop Gregory Palmer (West Ohio Conference) and Bishop Grant Hagiya (California Pacific Conference) committed to giving \$1,000 each to ministries in their conferences that address homelessness and challenged churches in each conference to partner with them to help meet the needs of the homeless in our communities. The ministries in each of the seven districts in the West Ohio Conference receiving \$100 from Bishop Palmer include: Broad Street UMC (Columbus North); The Disciple Factory (Cox UMC - Columbus South); Lifewell at First UMC (Foothills); Aley UMC in partnership with Family Promise of Greene County (Miami Valley); Toledo St. Paul UMC and Napoleon St. Paul UMC (Maumee Watershed); Westside UMC and Lima Trinity UMC (Northwest Plains); The Gathering (Ohio River Valley); and Staunton UMC with Second Chance/Washington C.H. (Shawnee Valley).

In addition to the Bishops' challenge, a friendly competition emerged between Mark Nakagawa, Superintendent of the California-Pacific West District, and our own District Superintendent Todd Anderson. While Cincinnati suffered an emotional Super Bowl loss, Cincinnati's United Methodists "beat" their Los Angeles partners by raising a total of \$38,579.39 for hunger relief. The total raised between the two cities was \$56,037.97.

It is not too late to help! Many in our communities continue to face homelessness and food insecurity. So how might you help? By supporting a local food pantry such as The Salvation Army Food Pantry or churches such as The Gathering and their ministry for the homeless in Middletown.


