As we enjoy, let us remember to be faithful to The One who makes all of our fun possible; The One who gives deeper virtues than any activity. The Almighty never takes a vacation from caring for us. Beloved, be mindful during these months to be faithful in sharing your talent and treasure with the bride of Jesus Christ: His Church.

The 53rd Annual Session of West Ohio Conference will be held virtually on Friday, June 3rd and Saturday, June 4th. The theme for Annual Conference is *Becoming*, referencing the passage from 1 John:

² Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made known. But we know that when Christ appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is. 1 John 3:2 (NIV)

There is always a Clergy Session held weeks prior to the Annual Conference. During Clergy Session new clergy are commissioned and those clergy who completed a provisional period are ordained. Retired clergy are also celebrated. As I think about the challenges churches face in a post-pandemic era, in terms of membership decline, financial challenges, as well as the division of the United Methodist Church denomination rooted in the issue of human sexuality, the theme of Becoming is appropriate. Local churches continue to ponder whether to disaffiliate from the UMC or stay. wondering, "what will we become?" What are we becoming as a church body through all of this turmoil and uncertainty? How are we being transformed? These are the questions that arise. I reflect on the poignant homily delivered by Rev. Dr. Suzanne Allen:

"We must put our hope in the one who will transform us. We are children of God and will be like Christ. It's not pretty but hopeful. We must cheer one another on . . . what we will be has not yet been revealed."


The anxious question of "what will we become" is answered by placing our hope in the one who has the power to transform us. We will become what we allow God to do in and through us. Amen.

In the transformational process of our church, Bishop Gregory V. Palmer advised: "Let's do and say the things that build one another up. Let's be the people today that, imperfect as we are, would not do or say anything that is *unbecoming*." I was certainly convicted by this statement! Beloved, we have power over who we become as individuals, and what we become as a church. Too often we interfere with God's intended work within us. It matters what we do and say to one another.

I am an Ordained Elder of the United Methodist Church and intend to remain so. As CUMC becomes, there remains work to do. As the appointed pastor of CUMC, I will lead this body to become what Jesus desires her to become. I hold to the directive of Bishop Palmer: "You are on a mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. I've never seen a storm that after awhile didn't pass over."

And the church said, "Amen."
